



HOLISTIC CARE

In order to raise healthy, well-rounded children, we believe the whole child must be cared for. Children of the Nations emphasizes *holistic care*, addressing physical, educational, social, and spiritual growth in all of our children. We seek to create an environment that meets the child's basic needs, encourages their individual desires and passions, and promotes excellence in achievement.

Physical Needs

We meet our children's physical needs by providing nourishing food, vitamin supplements, medical and dental care, and sports programs that emphasize physical fitness. Whether provided through our family-style Children's Homes or our Village Partnership Program, our children's physical health is of utmost priority.

Educational Needs

Our children's educational needs are addressed through quality education (preschool through university), skills training for those geared toward vocational careers, and a Challenge Children's program for children with special needs. Education is key to raising children who will transform their nations.

Social Needs

Within each child is the desire to know who they are, where they are from, and how they fit into the world. We recognize the value of culture, therefore our children are raised by caregivers of their own culture, in their own country. Traditional ethnic music, dance, storytelling, and dress are encouraged as an important part of their heritage. By partnering with village or community leaders, our children grow up with strong ties to their communities. We also provide opportunities for our children (especially our orphaned children) to maintain connections with relatives or extended families.

Spiritual Needs

Through sound Biblical training, evangelistic activities and outreaches (such as summer camps and youth retreats), scripture memory, devotionals, worship, and discipleship, our children are introduced to Jesus Christ and taught of His love for them. Our desire is to raise children who demonstrate a vibrant and authentic faith in Jesus Christ.

How do I strengthen my forgiving heart?

- 1. **Decide** You will never forgive if you wait until you feel like it. Choose to obey God and steadfastly resist the devil in his attempts to poison you with bitter thoughts. Make a quality decision to forgive, and God will heal your wounded emotions in due time (see Matthew 6:12-14).
- 2. **Depend** You cannot forgive without the power of the Holy Spirit. It's too hard to do on your own. If you are truly willing, God will enable you, but you must humble yourself and cry out to Him for help. In <u>John 20:22-23</u> Jesus breathed on the disciples and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit!" His next instruction was about forgiving people. Ask God to breathe the Holy Spirit on you so you can forgive those who've hurt you.
- 3. **Obey** The Word tells us several things we're to do concerning forgiving our enemies:

Pray for your enemies and those who abuse and misuse you.

Pray for their happiness and welfare (see <u>Luke 6:27-28</u>). As you pray, God can give them revelation that will bring them out of deception. They may not even be aware they hurt you, or maybe they're aware but are so self-centered that they don't care. Either way, they need revelation.

Bless and do not curse them (Romans 12:14).

In the Greek to bless means "to speak well of" and to curse means "to speak evil of." You can't walk in forgiveness and be a gossip. You must stop repeating the offense. You can't get over it if you continue to talk about it. <u>Proverbs 17:9</u> says that he who covers an offense seeks love.

- -It's not about our achievements at all. It's about Christ's achievement and a constant dependence on him regardless of one's station in life good, or bad.

What do you think pleases God?

(help someone, tell the truth, forgive someone who has hurt you, listen to your parents, share your toys, tell someone about God even when you are scared too, etc).

- -In Galatians 5:22, it tells us what actions please God: But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness,
- -Isn't it hard, very hard sometimes to do those things which God very clearly told us to do?
- -So, what the bible verse is saying here is that God Himself will help us to do **ALL** the things in the Bible that He has told us to do!
- -How do we get God's help? (We pray and ask God for help)
- -I need God's help ALL the time, because I can not do everything that God wants me too. Like, this person was driving me crazy and being so annoying I wanted to yell at them, but I knew God wouldn't want me to, so I prayed and asked God for help to be patient and kind. And you know what? God helped me. I was only then able to be patient and kind.



Some people never even get around to starting important things. These people are called "procrastinators". Other people start lots of things and never finish any of them. This is because they are not fully committed to any one goal.


